## Homophones and near Homophones

Some words sound the same or very similar, but they are spelt differently and have different meanings.

These words are called **homophones** or **near homophones**.

**homophone:** **pray** and **prey**  
**to** and **two**

**near homophone:** **quiet** and **quite**

### Common Exception Words

We have been learning to spell the common exception words **journey** and **area**.

### Grammar

When direct speech does not end with a full stop, a question mark or an exclamation mark, we use a comma **inside** the speech marks, e.g.

**“That cake looks delicious,” said the boy.**

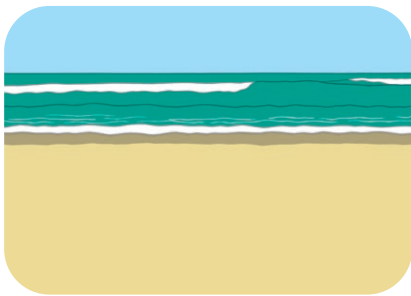
