Teaching of Reading in Y2

Following on from the previous information about the change in reading books coming home, the next step is a change in the way we read with children in school. From this week, children in Year 2 will be having a whole class reading lesson every day. This is to focus on building pace and fluency, broadening vocabulary, as well as increasing awareness of punctuation. Most children will not have a sticker in their reading record from their teacher, although some may still have a sticker as they need more 1:1 reading opportunities. Children will bring home the text from their reading lesson to share at home. Similar lessons will begin in Year 1 in the near future.
